We are writing to inform you of an exciting change to the after-school club at Gilnahirk Primary School. Beginning in September 2025, the club will be operated by Sinead Mooney and Cathy McClune.

Sinead and Cathy currently run Astoria Kindergarten, an Early Years setting based in Gilnahirk Primary School. Together, they bring 48 years of experience working with children ranging from two years old to young adults in their twenties. Working from a child centred approach, they are deeply passionate about empowering young children, and helping them realise their full potential.

Cathy and Sinead are both educated in BA Hons (Early Childhood Studies). They are also qualified designated Safeguarding and Child-protection Officers and hold their paediatric first aid.

The breakfast & after-school club will centre around the voice of the child approach and will use the children's ideas and interests to inform all future planning. They will offer a variety of engaging activities for your children, including:

- Arts and crafts
- Small world play
- Role-play
- Board games
- Free play outdoors
- Forest school play
- Photography
- Cookery

- Gardening and caring for our school environment
- Mindfulness and relaxation
- Music
- Multi-skills and gymnastics
- Football (both Gaelic and soccer)

The club will reflect the vibrant and successful ethos of Gilnahirk Primary School, providing children with a warm and welcoming "home away from home" experience.

Astoria Kindergarten and its wraparound care facilities will be thoroughly inspected and vetted by the Belfast Health and Social Care Trust. Child-to-adult ratios will adhere to the Trust's guidance for safety and supervision, ensuring the highest standards of care.

At present, we are exploring the current care options and the needs of parents for the future. 


